JA Experiential Programs



JA BizTown is an unmatched learning experience where 5th grade students interact within a simulated economy and take on the role of employee, taxpayer, and consumer. Students discover the intricacies of being a professional and a member of the community while working a specific role within a company, and they also discover the wealth of opportunities available within their city and beyond.



JA Finance Park

JA Finance Park is an immersive program where 7th graders create and maintain a household budget. Students have the rare opportunity to experience their personal financial futures first-hand. Every student receives a life scenario that includes education, family size, and income, which they must manage.



JA Inspire

A Inspire is more than a career fair: It brings the business community and local schools together and is designed to help launch high school students into their future. The program consists of three segments: (1) pre-event career oriented sessions; (2) the JA Inspire event, and (3) a post-event reflection. The JA Inspire event provides students a powerful way to learn about real-world career opportunities and their local economy.
